



• Sustainable Hub to Engage into Rural Policies with Actors (SHERPA) was a four-year project (2019-2023) with 17 partners funded by the Horizon 2020 programme. Its aim was to gather knowledge that contributes to the formulation of recommendations for future policies relevant to EU rural areas, by creating a Science-Society-Policy interface which provides a hub for knowledge and policy.

Greece has three Multi-Actor Platforms (MAPs), focused on the region of Peloponnese, Western Greece and Attica. They are all regional platforms consisting of representatives of farmers- and agri-organisations, businesses, universities, civil society and regional government members.

Greece wants to make further progress on ecological, social and economic dimensions. Active stakeholder participation and innovative technologies are needed to monitor and evaluate related intervention outcomes. Greece is, however, below the EU average in the level of digitalisation. Further developing (e-)governance and stakeholder involvement in rural policymaking would be desirable.

1. Pathways to Tackling Climate Change in Rural Areas

1.1. Key scientific evidence

Several climatic parameters and effects relating to the countries around the Mediterranean basin have been reported by the European Environment Agency (ESA, 2017) including: (i) the increase of extreme high temperatures; (ii) a decrease in rainfalls and river flow; (iii) increased competition for water use; (iv) a significant decline in crop yields; (v) increased risks for livestock production; (vi) an increase in mortality rates due to heat waves; (vii) reduced capacity in energy production; (viii) increased energy consumption for cooling purposes during heat waves; and (x) time shifts in summer tourism. Moreover, climate change will trigger risks (e.g. droughts, forest fires and biodiversity loss) affecting negatively the environment and the most economic sectors.





Figure 1. (a) Spatial distribution of the average annual temperature increase (°C) in the reference period 1971-2000; (b) expected differences in the spatial distribution of the average annual temperature increase (°C) during the period 2026-2045.

According to simulations based on climatic models [1], the average annual temperature, both at the shortand medium-term, is expected to increase. Specifically, in Greece (Figure 1) the highest increase in average annual temperatures is estimated to take place during the period 2046-2065 (up to 2.6°C).

CITIZENS, EQUALITY, RIGHTS AND VALUES PROGRAMME (CERV)

- Combines the previous programmes, Europe for Citizens and Rights, Equality and Citizenship Programme
- With a budget of €1.55 billion for 2021 2027, CERV is the biggest-ever EU funding programme for promoting and protecting fundamental rights, rule of law, and democracy inside the EU.

EXAMPLE: CHILDREN AS CHAMPIONS OF CHANGE

- UNICEF, as intergovernmental UN agency, works in over 190 countries and territories to save children's lives, to defend their rights, and to help them fulfil their potential, from early childhood through adolescence.
- Project lead: UNICEF Ireland
- Project goals:
 - Increase awareness in key stakeholders about child rights;
 - Supports "Child Rights Schools" (CRS) to embed child participation and respect for child rights in educational settings
 - Improve rights-based inclusive, meaningful child participation, and voice and influence in the public sphere.
- Two-year project co-funded by the Rights, Equality and Citizenship Programme
- total Grant of €876,995 (80% of total 1.1m project expenses)
- Participating partners are UNICEF National Committees in Austria, France, Germany, Iceland, Ireland (lead), Netherlands and Portugal.
